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Brentwood Unified School District:

Free meals for the children in their family.

Children must be present in order for meals to be provided, all children ages 18 and under are welcome to participate and no information will be needed.

Meals will be served between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. Monday - Friday

Schools Offering Meals:

- Brentwood Elementary 200 Griffith Lane (main parking lot)
- Pioneer Elementary 2010 Shady Willow Lane (bus loop)
- Edna Hill Middle School 140 Birch Street (bus loop near front office)

Antioch Unified School District:

Children must be present in the car to receive a bag

Walk ups are welcome but they must take the food off site to be eaten due to shelter in place, food may not be consumed on site

Marsh Elementary: 2304 G St 10:00 am - 12:00 pm

Deer Valley High School: 4700 Lone Tree Way 10:00 am - 12:00 pm

Oakley Unified School District:

To Go breakfasts and lunches will be available for all kids between the ages of 2 and 18

Kids MUST be present to receive meals

Meals provided on Mondays and Thursdays at the following locations and times:

Oakley Elementary School 10-11am

Iron House Elementary School: 10-11am

(Mondays = 3 breakfasts and 3 lunches; Thursdays + 2 breakfasts and 2 lunches)

CalFresh (previously known as Food Stamps):

Undocumented immigrants are generally not eligible for CalFresh however, if your children are US citizens, they may qualify and you can apply on behalf of them. You must provide citizenship or immigration status only for the person you are applying on behalf of. If you are undocumented, you do not need to provide any information about yourself. Simply state, "I am not applying for myself."

Women Infants and Children (WIC)

Health and Nutrition program for new pregnant women, new mothers, babies up to 1 year and children up to 5 years old.

You may be eligible if you are pregnant or have children under the age of 5
